

**25TH ASIAN CYCLING CHAMPIONSHIPS AND 12TH JUNIOR CYCLING
CHAMPIONSHIPS – 11TH TO 18TH DECEMBER 2005 AT LUDHIANA,
(PUNJAB) INDIA.**

COMMUNIQUE – 3 (DATED 24.10.2005)

As you are aware that 25th Asian Cycling Championships and 12th Asian Junior Cycling Championships for Men & Women, Boys & Girls, is being organized by the Cycling Federation of India from 11th to 19th December 2005 at Ludhiana (Punjab), India. The following important points may kindly be noted carefully :-

- i) You must reach at Delhi International Airport on 8^h December 2005 late evening or 9^h December 2005 early morning so that all the teams can be assembled and taken to Ludhiana by Road along with their equipment in Deluxe Buses and Trucks. When you land at Delhi Airport, our representative(s) will meet you in the arrival lounge, where you can take a little rest and wash and then all the teams would leave together for Ludhiana. Our representative(s) will give you baggage tags in sufficient numbers. You are requested to put your name and the country and tie it to your baggage to be put in the trucks so that on arrival at Ludhiana, there is no confusion. This is very important and you should take care of your baggage properly and get the baggage loaded in the trucks before your own eyes.
- ii) All of you have not sent us the desired information like number of participants, male and female separately and number of officials male and female separately as requested earlier. You have also not indicated if you want few single occupancy rooms. This information is very badly needed in order to book proper hotel accommodation. Ludhiana is not a Capital city and as such we have to book accommodation in advance. You are again requested to supply the above information **immediately per return e-mail.**
- iii) The organizer will provide you boarding (three meals a day) and lodging within the amount already intimated to you. However, any extra hotel charges like drinks, telephone calls, laundry charges will be directly settled by you with the hotel.
- iv) December is a cold month in India and the temperature may drop to about 8^o-10^o Centigrade and Entry Forms and list of Events to be conducted has already been circulated and is available on our Website www.cyclingfederationofindia.org. You may visit our website and download the necessary copies of required documents and send the detailed entries to us with three passport size photographs of all the participants and officials so that their accreditation cards may be kept ready on your arrival. You should put your name and country name at the back of the photographs in CAPITAL LETTERS. The accreditation card is a must and is required for security reasons, identification at the dope control center.

- v) You have already been intimated that if you are above 19 years of age on 1st January 2005, you will be put into Senior (Elite) group and if you are below 19 years of age on 1st January 2005, you will be put in the Junior Group. In case of all outsiders, the age will be verified from the Passport. In case of India, some riders who have never gone abroad and may not have their passport but in that case, they have to show their valid rider license for age verification and identification purposes.
- vi) You are also reminded that by 20th November 2005, you have to send your detailed entries by name so that we are able to prepare the detailed working programme in advance.
- vii) We have already prepared the detailed programme and put it on our Website www.cyclingfederationofindia.org, which you may refer but this is purely tentative, and may undergo slight change depending upon the receipt of actual entries.
- viii) Some countries are asking about the Velodrome and the Road Circuit again and again, when this has already been put in our earlier communiqués. However, it is again explained that the Velodrome is of concrete base and is of 333.33 meter and is without cover situated in Punjab Agricultural University, Ludhiana. The Road Races will be conducted on National Highway No. 1. During the competition, one side of the National High Way will be closed for a limited period. The Road Circuit is absolutely flat and with no up & down and only U-turn on same side of the Road will be required. The length of the circuit is 17.5 KM up and 17.5 KM down, so that one round makes 35 Km. For shorter distances, the U-turn will be taken at earlier point(s) depending upon the length of the Race. Surface of the Road is Asphalt.
- ix) On your arrival at Ludhiana on 9th December 2005, we would hold Manager's Meeting in the evening at Punjab Agricultural University. In case of any other information required about Ludhiana, where the championship is to be conducted, you may contact the Organizing Secretary Mr. Amrit Kaur Gill, on her Mobile Phone No. 985567-98666. Country Code of India is 91 and City Code of Ludhiana is 161.
